Inclusive Language: Here at Broadway we have an inclusive language policy that recognizes and affirms the full range of diversity among persons engaged in the communication process. We are intentional that our imagery of God as well as our liturgy reflect that inclusiveness. *We use a variety of pronouns for God, just as our community uses a variety of pronouns as we grow and learn beyond the binary. ***God's Story in Scripture**

Mark 9:2-9

Six days after that, Jesus took Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. And there Jesus was transfigured before their eyes; the clothes Jesus wore became dazzlingly white—whiter than any earthly bleach could make them. Elijah appeared to them, as did Moses, and the two were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. “Rabbi,” he said, “how wonderful it is for us to be here! Let us make three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah!” Peter did not know what he was saying, so overcome were they all with awe. Then a cloud formed, overshadowing them; and there came a voice from out of the cloud: “This is my Beloved, my Own; listen to this One.” Then suddenly, when they looked around, they saw no one with them anymore—only Jesus. As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until after the Promised One had risen from the dead.

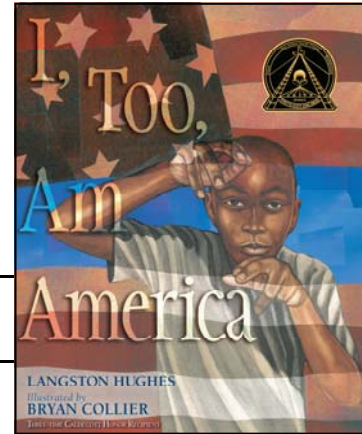

| <p><b>FEBRUARY MISSION MINUTES</b></p> <p><b>Youth Lounge</b> provides a bi-monthly safe space for resilient youth and young people of the Lakeview community. Operating since March 2010, YL currently has 60-70 youth participants on average each Youth Lounge. YL provides a home cooked meal, as well as space for creative expression, games, and warmth. YL also often offers a “dressing room” clothing area as well. Our youth participants are primarily those who identify as LGBTQ, 90% people of color, 55% homeless. Additional participants include Broadway volunteers who receive comprehensive training and participate in the Lounge, interacting alongside the youth.</p> <p><b>Casa Catalina Basic Human Needs Center</b> (4537 S Ashland Ave) provides intake for clothing, emergency shelter, emergency financial assistance for bills, referral, advocacy, short-term case management, a food pantry and information on government benefits screening. Casa Catalina primarily serves residents in the Back of the Yards – 35th to 51st Street between Racine and Western. Although it’s identified as being run by Catholic Charities, for all practical purposes it’s been run by one 70 year old nun, Sr. Joellen Tumas. Sr. Joellen has been working in Back of the Yards for most of her life, and has been the life line of this pantry since 1990. While most of the residents served are from the neighborhood, Sr. Joellen doesn’t turn folks away who are in need.</p> <p><b>You can donate throughout the month</b> – make checks out to Broadway and designate “February Mission Minute” (split between both) or “Youth Lounge” or “Casa Catalina.” You can also donate <a href="#">online</a>.</p> |
