***Gospel Reading: Matthew 20:1-16**

[Jesus said:] "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard. After he agreed with the workers to pay them a denarion (a typical day's wage), he sent them into his vineyard. Then he went out around nine in the morning and saw others standing around the marketplace doing nothing. He said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard, and I'll pay you whatever is right.' And they went. Again around noon and then at three in the afternoon, he did the same thing. Around five in the afternoon he went and found others standing around, and he said to them, 'Why are you just standing around here doing nothing all day long?' 'Because nobody has hired us,' they replied. He responded, 'You also go into the vineyard.' When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his manager, 'Call the workers and give them their wages, beginning with the last ones hired and moving on finally to the first.' When those who were hired at five in the afternoon came, each one received a denarion. Now when those hired first came, they thought they would receive more. But each of them also received a denarion. When they received it, they grumbled against the landowner, 'These who were hired last worked one hour, and they received the same pay as we did even though we had to work the whole day in the hot sun.' But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I did you no wrong. Didn't I agree to pay you a denarion? Take what belongs to you and go. I want to give to this one who was hired last the same as I give to you. Don't I have the right to do what I want with what belongs to me? Or are you resentful because I'm generous?' So those who are last will be first. And those who are first will be last."

Here ends the reading of the Gospel. This is the Good News of Jesus Christ.

A Time for Young Christians

[During the Time for Young Christians, you are invited to use the Prayer Cards in the pew pockets to indicate prayer concerns you would like lifted up in prayer during this week. They can be placed in the offering plate or posted on the prayer wall. Children are invited to return to their seats following the Time for Young Christians.]

Scripture Reading: Exodus 16:2-15

The whole Israelite community complained against Moses and Aaron in the desert. The Israelites said to them, "Oh, how we wish that YHWH had just put us to death while we were still in the land of Egypt. There we could sit by the pots cooking meat and eat our fill of bread. Instead, you've brought us out into this desert to starve this whole assembly to death." Then YHWH said to Moses, "I'm going to make bread rain down from the sky for you. The people will go out each day and gather just enough for that day. In this way, I'll test them to see whether or not they follow my instruction. On the sixth day, when they measure out what they have collected, it will be twice as much as they collected on other days." So Moses and Aaron said to all the Israelites, "This evening you will know that it was YHWH who brought you out of the land of Egypt. And in the morning you will see YHWH's glorious presence, because your complaints against YHWH have been heard. Who are we? Why blame us?" Moses continued, "YHWH will give you meat to eat in the

evening and your fill of bread in the morning because YHWH heard the complaints you made. Who are we? Your complaints aren't against us but against YHWH." Then Moses said to Aaron, "Say to the whole Israelite community, 'Come near to YHWH, because YHWH has heard your complaints.'" As Aaron spoke to the whole Israelite community, they turned to look toward the desert, and just then the glorious presence of YHWH appeared in the cloud. YHWH spoke to Moses, "I've heard the complaints of the Israelites. Tell them, 'At twilight you will eat meat. And in the morning you will have your fill of bread. Then you will know that I am YHWH your God.'" In the evening a flock of quail flew down and covered the camp. And in the morning there was a layer of dew all around the camp. When the layer of dew lifted, there on the desert surface were thin flakes, as thin as frost on the ground. When the Israelites saw it, they said to each other, "What is it?" They didn't know what it was. Moses said to them, "This is the bread that YHWH has given you to eat."

May God bless the speaking and hearing of the Word.

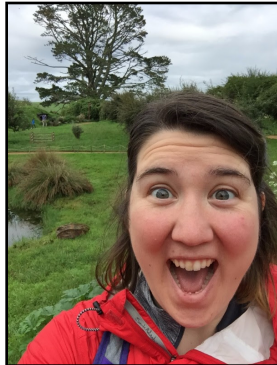

There will be a collection bin set up in Friendship Hall - you can donate supplies from the list below, or make monetary donations to help with buying supplies or with shipping. Cleaning Kit Materials

- 5-gallon bucket with resealable lid (can be used, but must be cleaned – no buckets that have stored paint or other chemicals)
- Liquid laundry detergent (One 50-oz. or two 25-oz. bottle(s) only)
- Liquid household cleaner (12–16 oz. liquid cleaner that can be mixed with water – no spray)
- Dish soap (16–28 oz. bottle any brand)
- 1 can air freshener
- 1 insect repellent spray (6-14 oz)
- 1 scrub brush (plastic or wooden handle)
- 18 cleaning wipes (Handi Wipes or reusable wipes)
- 7 sponges (non-cellulose)
- 5 scouring pads (nothing with soap built-in)
- 50 clothespins
- Clothesline (One 100-ft. or two 50-ft. lines)
- 24-roll heavy-duty trash bags (33– to 45-gallon sizes)
- 5 dust masks
- 2 pairs kitchen dishwashing gloves
- 1 pair work gloves (Cotton with leather palm or all leather)
