Welcome! We are glad that you have joined us for worship as we celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion today. The United Methodist Church practices “open communion” which means that any and all who respond to the invitation are welcome to share in the Sacrament.

Visitors: Please record your **complete address**, as well as your name, on the registers. We’d like to send you a greeting! If you would like to take a short tour of the church building and grounds, meet one of our greeters at the Welcome Center after the service.

Inclusive Language: Here at Broadway we have an inclusive language policy that recognizes and affirms the full range of diversity among persons engaged in the communication process. We are intentional that our imagery of God as well as our liturgy reflect that inclusiveness. *We use a variety of pronouns for God, just as our community uses a variety of pronouns as we grow and learn beyond the binary. In the spirit of hospitality, please ask others for their preferred pronoun.* The pastors are available to answer any questions you might have regarding the policy. The entire inclusive language policy can be found on the website. A further resource is Paul Smith’s book, *Is it Okay to call God Mother?*.

Scripture Reading

2 Timothy 1:1-14

From Paul, by the will of God an apostle of Christ Jesus, sent to proclaim the promise of life in Christ Jesus, To Timothy, my dear child: May grace, mercy and peace from God the Creator and from Christ Jesus our Savior be with you. I thank God, the God of my ancestors — whom I worship with a clear conscience — whenever I remember you in my prayers, as indeed I do constantly, night and day. When I recall your tears, I long to see you again, which would fill me with joy. I'm reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois, then in our mother Eunice, and now, I'm certain, in you as well. That's why I want to remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God didn't give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love, of self-discipline. So don't be ashamed to give your testimony about Christ, and don't be ashamed of me, Christ's prisoner. But join with me in suffering for the Gospel by the power of God, who has saved us and called us to a holy life — not because of anything we have done, but because of God's own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time, but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who has destroyed death, and brought life and immortality to light through the Gospel. And it was for this Gospel that I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher. That's why I'm suffering as I am. Yet I'm not ashamed, because I know whom I have believed, and I'm convinced that Jesus Christ is able to guard what has been entrusted to me until that final Day. Take what you have heard me say as a model of sound teaching, in faith and love in Christ Jesus. Guard the rich deposit of faith with the help of the Holy Spirit, who dwells within us.

May God bless the speaking and hearing of the Word.

Community Partner for Common Good

Facilitation of services to ensure the health and welfare of Chicago's low income community, institutions, and residents.

UM Children's Fund for Christian Mission (Advance #3021113)

Background/History: The United Methodist Children's Fund for Christian Mission is jointly sponsored by GBGM and GBOD. The fund enables children to learn about children in other parts of the world, the importance of mission, and opportunities for mission giving. The Fund also supports projects around the world that are in ministry with children. All churches and individuals of all ages are invited to participate in supporting the Fund.

Goals & Objectives: (a) To develop materials on an annual basis for teaching children about children's projects around the world (b) To engage local churches in utilizing the materials as a way of educating children about other places in the world as well as important mission issues related to children (c) To nurture in children stewardship and mission giving (d) To raise financial support for various children's projects on an annual basis

Activities Plan: (a) Identify the 3-5 children's projects to be highlighted through the annual Children's Fund. (b) Prepare curriculum and activities about the projects, which can be used by churches and individuals. (c) Christian educators, parents, and individuals use materials to teach the children about the projects. (d) Children, utilizing the fundraising examples in the materials, raise funds for the projects. (e) Funds are collected by GBOD and GBGM. (f) Funds are distributed to the children's projects for support of their children's ministry.

Action: Get Registered to Vote.

Election day is November 8, 2016. In Cook County, early voting starts September 29th; you can vote downtown at 69 W Washington (9:00am to 5:00pm). Visit <http://www.chicagoelections.com/en/early-voting.html>. Starting October 24th, there are voting sites in all 50 wards.

Not sure if you are registered? Or have you moved since the primaries in March? Changed your name? October 11th is last day to register by mail AND – you may be able to register on line. But don't count on registering and voting on election day: a federal judge has declared Illinois' same day voter registration law unconstitutional. Decision is being challenged, but make sure you get registered now, so that your vote can be counted. 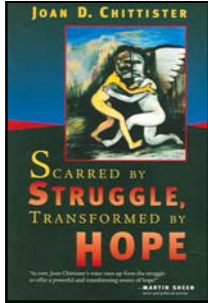

Adult Education Hour: Scarred by Struggle, Transformed by Hope by Joan Chittister “Everyone goes through times of pain and sorrow, depression and darkness, stress and suffering. It is in the necessary struggles of life, however, that we stretch our souls and gain new insights enabling us to go on. Building on the biblical story of Jacob wrestling with God and on the story of her own battle with life-changing disappointment, Sister Joan Chittister deftly explores the landscape of suffering and hope, considering along the way such wide-ranging topics as consumerism, technology, grief, the role of women in the Catholic Church, and the events of September 11, 2001. We struggle, she says, against change, isolation, darkness, fear, powerlessness, vulnerability, exhaustion, and scarring; and while these struggles sometimes seem insurmountable, we can emerge from them with the gifts of conversion, detachment, faith, courage, surrender, limitations, endurance, transformation, and (perhaps most important) hope. Each of these struggles and gifts is discussed in a chapter of its own.” Join us for discussion, **Sundays at 10am.**
