KWANZAA PRINCIPLES AND LIGHTING OF CANDLES

(A Christian Affirmation of the Nguzo Saba. Inspired by The African American Lectionary, a collaborative project of American Bible Pulpit & American Baptist College of Nashville, 2012.)

Spirit of God, enable us to acknowledge and accept the deity of the Triune God who is the Creator, Provider, Sustainer, and Savior of humanity. We ask You to bless our worship experience as we embrace the Seven Principles of Kwanzaa: Bless this assembly and all African and other symbols used in this service.

All Wise God, grant us wisdom and understanding as in the days of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob to honor the call to be Your chosen people. Having been brought to an unfamiliar land, and marked by this history, allow us to acknowledge You as the God who never left us.

I light the Kwanzaa candle for the **1st Principle: UMOJA (Unity)**. Umoja stresses the importance of togetherness within the family and within the community, which is reflected in the African saying, "I am We," or "I am because We are."

God, we invoke Your holy presence as we identify, recall, and relay the first principle of unity. Help us to be a unified people while interacting with various communities: family, neighbors, friends, nations, and races, as unity is a blessing from God.

May we employ the element of unity as we continue to acknowledge the Triune God. May we strive to maintain the true spirit of unity as we walk as your people around the world.

I light the Kwanzaa candle for the **2nd Principle: KUJICHAGULIA (Self-Determination)** which requires that we define our common interested and make decisions that are in the best interest of our family and community.

God, as we call and relay the second principle of self-determination, teach us how to be self-determining believers as You created us. Help us to know Your will for our lives so that we may help others.

We will learn to live self-determined lives knowing that our actions must help others and ourselves.

I light the Kwanzaa candle for the **3rd Principle: UJIMA (Collective Work and Responsibility)**. This reminds us of our obligation to the past, present and future and that we have a role not just as individuals but also as members of a larger body—the community, society, and the world.

God, grant us the wisdom to develop and maintain collective interests. Teach us how to think collectively and build collectively the family unit and our neighborhoods and to truly be each other's keeper as You are the Keeper of our souls.

We will strive to embody a spirit of collective work and responsibility, building and maintaining our communities as did our ancestors.

I light the Kwanzaa candle for the **4th Principle: UJAMAA (Collective Economics)**. It reminds us that we should pay attention to the resources that come through us and that we should constantly monitor how we use and share our resources for the collective strength to meet common needs through mutual effort and aid.

God, grant us the wisdom to have the tenacity to build and maintain businesses within our communities. Teach us how to think and build cost-effective businesses that will be profitable for both the owner and consumer. Teach us to be mainly savers not consumers.

God has provided for us. We will be good and faithful stewards over all that Godhas provided. Together we will build and profit.

I light the Kwanzaa candle for the **5th Principle: NIA (Purpose)**. Nia encourages us to look within ourselves and set personal goals to benefit the one and the many for the good of the community. We exist for the purposes of worship, ministry, evangelism, fellowship, and discipleship.

We will keep God's commandments! This is our purpose. We will love God and our neighbor as ourselves; this is our purpose. We will live as a beacon to the world; we will live as those who give light to the world; and as salt that gives flavor to the world. This is our purpose.

I light the Kwanzaa candle for the **6th Principle: KUUMBA (Creativity).** Kuumba is an affirmation of our ability to create and make what we do and how we do it. What we do, distinguishes our culture as one of great power and energy.

God, help us to continue to share our creativity with the world through music, painting, food, dance, worship, and all endeavors in which we engage. We honor the creativity of our people.

We acknowledge the creative genius of God that is provided for all creation to enjoy. Allow us to keep our minds and hearts open so that God can create what the world needs through us.

I light the Kwanzaa candle for the **7th Principle: IMANI (Faith)**. Imani requires that we believe in our own self worth, have confidence in our ability and capacity to excel, honoring the best of our traditions, while drawing upon the best in ourselves to succeed in building a better future.

As we call and relay the seventh principle, God, help us to be greater people of faith.

We have come this far by faith. We affirm the values and customs of our ancestors and give thanks for their sojourn as we seek to emulate the best of what they have bequeath to us. We have faith in God, faith in one another, faith in our race, faith in ourselves, and faith in humanity. Lest we forget...!
