

After being commissioned as a provisional deacon in May, I was appointed by the bishop to serve at Reconciling Ministries Network in my position there as Director of Communications. After the nudging of the Spirit, I decided in October to move from my much beloved position at RMN to form a new ministry called enfleshed. In collaboration with Rev. Anna Blaedel and a phenomenal board, we are working to "bring what matters back to the gospel for justice, liberation, and delight" through ecumenical and progressive spiritual resources. At the time of this report, I have not yet received a response regarding my appointment to enfleshed. Meanwhile, I am so pleased to remain in ministry at my secondary appointment at Broadway UMC where I am able to assist in worship, preach on occasion, offer pastoral support to congregants, and help the congregation grow in its depth of understanding and commitment to justice making, especially in regards to the needs of the LGBTQ community. To be a deacon at Broadway is a deeply meaningful piece of my pastoral identity and ministry - alongside the more explicit aspects of pastoral leadership at Broadway, I'm grateful to be in the work of ministry together with my fellow Broadway community members in the everyday ministries of relationship, community building, and spiritual formation.
