SCRIPTURE READING: Romans 6:1-11 (Inclusive Bible)

What can we say, then? Should we go on sinning so that grace might abound? Of course not! We're dead to sin, so how can we continue to live in it? Don't you know that when we were baptized into Christ Jesus, we were baptized into Christ's death? We've been buried with Jesus through baptism, and we joined with Jesus in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by God's glory, we too might live a new life. For if we have been united with Christ in the likeness of Christ's death, we will also be united with Christ in the likeness of Christ's resurrection. We must realize that our former selves have been crucified with Christ to make the body of sin and failure completely powerless, to free us from slavery to sin: for when people die, they have finished with sin. But we believe that, having died with Christ, we will also live with Christ—knowing that Christ, having been raised form the dead, will never die again: death is now powerless over our Savior.

When Christ died, Christ died to sin, once for all, so that the life Christ lives is now life in God. In this way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin—but alive to God in Christ Jesus. The Word of God for the people of God. Thanks be to God. Amen.


