SCRIPTURE READING: Genesis 22:1-14 (Inclusive Bible)

After these events, God tested Abraham. "Abraham!" God called. "Here I am," Abraham replied. "Take your son," God said, "your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, "Seeina." Offer him there as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you." Rising early the next morning, Abraham saddled a donkey and took along two workers and his son Isaac. Abraham chopped wood for the burnt offering, and started on the journey to the place God showed them. On the third day, Abraham looked up and saw the place in the distance. Then Abraham said to the workers, "Stay here with the donkey. The boy and I will go over there; we will worship and come back to you." Abraham took wood for the burnt offering and gave it to Isaac to carry. In his own hands he carried the fire and the knife. Then the two of them went on alone. Isaac said, "Father!" "Here I am, my child," Abraham replied. "Here are the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for the burnt offering?" Abraham answered, "My child, God will provide the lamb for the burnt offering." Then the two of them went on together. When they arrived at the place God had pointed out, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged wood on it. Then he tied up his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill the child. But the angel of God called to him from heaven: "Abraham! Abraham!" "Here I am!" he replied. "Do not raise your hand against the boy!" the angel said. "Do not do the least thing to him. I know now how deeply you revere God, since you did not refuse me your son, your only child." Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. He went and took the ram, and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his child. Abraham called the place "God Provides," and so it is said to this day: "On this mountain YHWH provides."

HYMN: "Welcome"



May we, with hopes of fostering love and furthering justice, practice such care


