2020 Census

In a year in which the onslaught of bad news seems never-ending, it is difficult to discern what challenges to address first. We know of one thing that is especially important: participation is the 2020 Census.

The 2020 Census is an important once a decade opportunity to ensure your community receives the representation and resources it needs. The Census

determines the number of seats each state will have in the House of Representatives and how Federal funding is distributed to schools, hospital, public transit, and other vital programs. Head Start, the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), and the Pell Grant programs (and more) are ALL impacted by the Census, among many other services that your community needs.

If you haven't completed the census yet, there's still time to do so. Visit <u>2020census.gov</u> or call 844-330-2020 to complete your Census questionnaire by Monday, October 5, 2020. Mailed questionnaires must be postmarked **by October 5**, **2020**.

We urge you to take the time and ensure that you and your family are counted.

One Block At a Time, We Are Building Together

MBMHMC is a grassroots nonprofit community organization founded by activist Jahmal Cole. Their mission is to help inspire and care for youth on the south and west sides by showing them how goals can change the outcome of a situation and influence the choices people make. Cole has become a mentor to youth and adults through his work in creating volunteer initiatives and block clubs in low-income communities. Some of their programs are:

- Youth Summer Job Opportunities provided 6,000+ Youth Wellness Calls to Seniors in their Youth Senior Connect Program; 330+ tour participants in their Youth Led Tours, showing North Lawndale to hundreds of first time visitors. A total of 93 young people were employed this summer in all of their youth development programs.
- Explorers Program provides underprivileged youth with an awareness of the world and opportunities beyond their neighborhood. Students are taken on explorations focused on STEM,

Arts & amp; Culture, Citizenry & amp; Volunteerism, Health, Community Development, Culinary Arts, and Entrepreneurism.

- The **Small Business Relief Fund** collected \$1 million in just two days to help businesses make repairs after looting.
- Chicago Police Dept Cadet Tours. For the second consecutive summer, youth in North Lawndale have been employed and empowered to lead CPD cadets on tours of their community. "We want future officers to know and fall in love with the communities they will one day serve, and have positive connections with the young people of the community."

Jahmal Cole received a 2020 Elevating Youth Voices award and a Red Cross Heroes award. Look for a documentary about MBMHMC, yet to be released, titled **Tiny Ripple of Hope**.
