Gospel Reading Luke 14:25-33

Large crowds followed Jesus. He turned to them and said, "If any of you come to me without turning your back on your [parents], your loved ones, your [siblings], indeed your very self, you can't be my follower. Anyone who doesn't take up the cross and follow me can't be my disciple. If one of you were going to build a tower, wouldn't you first sit down and calculate the outlay to see if you have enough money to complete the project? You'd do that for fear of laying the foundation and then not being able to complete the work—because anyone who saw it would jeer at you and say, 'You started a building and couldn't finish it.' Or if the leaders of one country were going to declare war on another country, wouldn't they first sit down and consider whether, with an army of ten thousand, they could win against an enemy against them with twenty thousand? If they couldn't, they'd send a delegation while the enemy is still at a distance, asking for terms of peace. So count the cost. You can't be my disciples if you don't say goodbye to all of your possessions."

Here ends the reading of the Gospel. This is the Good News of Jesus Christ.
